The many miles of walking trails crisscrossing the Long Pond Greenbelt are available for everyone's enjoyment throughout the year. Limited parking is available at these access points: Mashashimuet Park in Sag Harbor; in North Sagaponack both at Poxabogue Park on Old Farm Road near the train trestle and where Old Farm ends at Haines Path; the Long Pond Greenbelt Nature Center at 1061 Bridgehampton-Sag Harbor Turnpike; the boat launch off Sprig Tree Path; the Round Pond Lane cul-de-sac; the SOFO parking lot at 377 Bridgehampton-Sag Harbor Turnpike for access to the Vineyard Field trails, and the Sagg Swamp Preserve entrance on Sagaponack Road.

The Long Pond Greenbelt shares its pathways with three other trail systems: Southampton Town's Hamlet-to-Hamlet Footpaths and Bay-to-Ocean Trail as well as Suffolk County's Paumanok Path, which runs 125 miles from Rocky Point to Montauk Point State Park.
